## Learning Beyond Classrooms

### Exposure Visit – HDB Financial Services (Ghatkopar)

Aspirants from Batch 2317 and 2391 explored corporate culture during an engaging visit to HDB Financial Services. Guided by Mr. Praveen, they learned about employability skills, workplace conduct, and processes. The highlight—three aspirants were selected for employment, making the visit inspiring, meaningful, and confidence-boosting.



### DSCI Cyber GCC Summit – Bengaluru

At the DSCI Cyber GCC Summit in Bengaluru, aspirants from Bright Future India explored cybersecurity trends alongside industry leaders. Their confidence and participation earned appreciation from DSCI and Deloitte, ending with Certificates of Appreciation. The summit offered valuable exposure, reinforcing that our youth are ready for emerging tech careers with enthusiasm and purpose.



### Fire Brigade Visit – Ghatkopar

Sixteen aspirants visited the Vikhroli Fire Brigade Station, gaining firsthand exposure to rescue operations and emergency response systems. Officers shared inspiring stories of bravery, demonstrated rescue robots and fire bikes, and showcased the control room. The experience left students deeply motivated, appreciating teamwork, discipline, and the courage displayed by real-life heroes.

## **GCS Hospital Visit -Ahmedabad**

Aspirants from batches 2334 and 2460 visited GCS Hospital for an insightful exposure experience. From learning about Ayushman Card benefits to understanding stress management through a session by Mr. Ashok, the visit was impactful. ### **- Tulsipada**



At just 19, Vivek Kharwa from our Thane center has rewritten his destiny. Coming from a humble family and the traditional Waghri community, he was expected to continue the age-old barter trade of exchanging utensils for clothes. His dreams seemed unrealistic until the Bulandi program opened a new path.

Once shy and hesitant, Vivek gradually built his skills in computers, communication, and typing. With growing confidence, he secured his first job at IPS Services, earning ₹14,000.

Today, Vivek stands tall as the first in his family to move into the organized sector. His journey is inspiring not just his parents, but his entire community proving that education brings dignity, opportunity, and a future beyond limitations.
